The May 2017 IFR number jumps out as incorrect. It is so out of line with other IFR #s as to lead one to question the competence of those who approved this chart. IFR numbers are always smaller than VFR at Buttonville especially at a training airport. This showed them almost three and half times the other months.

The 0's in the September to December field for 2017 was misleading as they were known by the time the report was released and should have been included. Then the totals at the bottom were not labeled as such but were for the 2016 year and so using the "nudge principle" (showing numbers lower than actual for 2017) the authors biased the reader to think the numbers in 2017 were much worse than they actually were.

This leads me to question the veracity of all the numbers in the study and the methodology of the study.

#### **Executive Summary**

....."

While the airport had been scheduled to close for redevelopment of the land for other uses, in April 2017, the Toronto-Buttonville airport operator announced it would continue airport operations until October 31, 2018 and possibly beyond that date should airport redevelopment dictate.

This paragraph is incorrect as Buttonville had told Nav Can they were not going to close on October 31, 2018 and in fact were growing the volumes with a flight school and attracting new clients. This had been told to Nav Can before the report was written. Additionally before the report was released the numbers were doubling and more. Even with this evidence Nav Can decided to close the tower in the busy summer months. It took a court challenge to stop that closure but then it appears Nav Can developed a strategy to "strangle" the airport and pretend it was re thinking the plan."

Nevertheless, activity at the airport has been declining. Toronto Airways, the primary flight training school at Buttonville up until December 2016, merged with the Canadian Flight Academy (based at the Oshawa airport) to become one of Canada's largest flight training schools. Toronto Airways moved its flight school operation to the Oshawa airport in December 2016. Following the move, aircraft movements at the Toronto-Buttonville airport have fallen. The total movements for 2016 were 34,623, both IFR and VFR. The projected traffic levels for 2017 by solely removing the Toronto Airways movements would be 20,428.

The Aeronautical Study supports the proposal to close the Toronto-Buttonville air traffic control tower and the CWO.

The highlighted area is grossly misleading and intended to set Buttonville up for failure. The actual number for the year was 26,108 and increasing by over 100% a month when this report was released by Nav Can. (but not corrected). Even worse is the fact that the annual traffic number was known to be an understatement when the report was written in October. In October the traffic number was 22,731 movements, well in excessive of the number shown above and that was two months from the year end. Also at that time Nav Can had been told that there was a replacement flight school at Buttonville. To justify closure and publish projections that are incorrect is unacceptable and well below the standard one expects from our regulators.
